President's Message, May 2024

Hello Alpha Sigma Sisters,

We had a fantastic Four-Chapter Meeting with our State President, Royce Boyd. Zeta, Lambda, and Alpha Omicron joined us at Gallo's, in New Castle, to fellowship together and witness the installation of the newly elected 2024-2026 Biennium Officers of Alpha Omicron and Alpha Sigma.

As a bonus, all members present had the opportunity to participate in a Recommitment Ceremony, officiated by President Royce. This reaffirmation of what membership in DKG means refreshed our commitment to the Society. The Seven Purposes were read and the DKG Crest, Colors, and symbolic Red Rose were presented to remind us of Annie Webb Blanton's vision for *Key Women Educators*.

State President Royce concluded our morning by sharing her "Building Communities" biennial theme. On her chapter visitation journeys, she has been able to talk to individual chapter members about the changing path of our Society. One concern expressed was how we were giving up past practices that many of our more senior members held so dear, causing some members to consider dropping out.

President Royce addressed this head on. Using an analogy of how change in some past educational practices occurred in order for us, as educators today, to do our jobs more effectively. She shared individual instances from several chapters and how they were able to overcome change concerns particular to their areas.

The key points in her discussion were, as members of the Society, our Mission <u>has not changed</u>, and our Purposes <u>have not changed</u>. We still provide "professional and personal growth for women educators, and excellence in education." We still promote the Seven Purposes.

- 1. To Unite Women Educators of the world in a genuine spiritual fellowship.
- 2. To Honor Women who have given or who evidence a potential for distinctive service in any field of education.
- 3. To Advance the professional interest and position of Women in Education.
- 4. To Initiate, Endorse, and Support desirable legislation in the interests of education and of Women Educators.
- 5. To Endow Scholarships to aid outstanding Women Educators in pursuing graduate study and to grant fellowships to Women educators from other countries.

- 6. To Stimulate the personal and professional growth of members and to encourage their participation in appropriate programs of action.
- 7. To Inform the membership of current economic, social, political, and educational issues to the end that they may become intelligent functioning members of a world society.

We have not strayed from the Mission or the Purposes. We are *evolving*. We are equipping our present members and aiding our new members to build on the unchanged foundational values of our Society to be relevant, vital, and sustainable.
