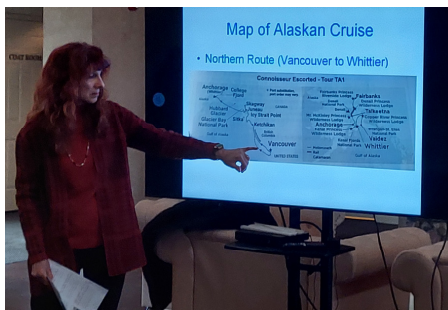
Yvonne shared Ms. Breigh-
